

Canine and Feline Boarding

Exams and Vaccines

All dogs must have been examined at Deschutes Animal Clinic within the last year and have current vaccinations; including Rabies, Distemper, Parvo, Lepto, (DHLPP) and Bordatella (Kennel Cough.) The Lepto vaccine is not required for pets that are allergic to it. If vaccinations are not current or written proof is not available, these vaccines will be given before admittance at the owner's expense.

All cats must have been examined at Deschutes Animal Clinic within the last year and have current vaccinations; including Rabies, Feline Distemper, Rhinotracheitis, Calici Virus (FVRCP) and Feline Leukemia. The Feline Leukemia vaccine is not required for cats that are indoor only. If these are not current or there is no written proof, these vaccines will be given before admittance at the owner's expense.

** It is highly recommended that vaccines are given at least 14 days prior to boarding. **

All pets must be free of internal and external parasites when admitted for boarding, otherwise they must be treated upon admission or examination by a doctor.

Food, Bedding and Care

We feed Hill's Prescription Diet, Science Diet and Royal Canin Veterinary Diets according to our doctor's recommendation or the life stages of the pet. Pets are fed twice daily. If your pet is on a diet other than those listed above or their system is sensitive to a change, it is recommended you bring their own food with feeding instructions. Your pet's favorite treats are always welcome.

We prefer to supply our own bedding as the bedding is washed daily to keep things sanitary. We would hate to misplace a favorite blanket, bed or towel. You may bring a favorite toy but we ask that his/her name is put on it to prevent getting misplaced

All dogs are walked at least three times a day, while geriatric pets may be walked more often if necessary.

Please be aware that your pet's diet may have varied, they may have barked at other pets, and in some cases boarding can be stressful. This can create problems such as sore throat, vomiting, or diarrhea. We seek to prevent such problems, but you must understand that these problems do sometimes develop, even with the best of care. Any pet that requires veterinary attention will receive care at our discretion and at the appropriate fees.

*** Always leave an emergency contact number at which you or a designated person can be reached.***

Medicines and Treatments

Pets requiring medications will be charged appropriate fees according to the number of medications and treatments needed per day. We offer boarding packages for pets on medication.

Senior Pets

While we require all pets to be seen within the last year, we recommend senior pets to be examined every six months. This is especially important for pets with deteriorating/declining health. If an exam is due, we would request you make an appointment with a doctor. Drop-off appointments are not advised, as they do not allow us extended contact with you.

Discharging

All Animals will be discharged only during regular office hours. No animals will be discharged when the clinic is closed, this includes holidays.
